Located halfway between San Francisco and Los Angeles on the historic Highway 1, the city of San Luis Obispo sets itself apart as the ideal hub for exploring the Central Coast of California. It's the perfect place to lay your head after a long day of exploration, and once you experience it, you'll fall in love. Because there's no life like the SLO Life.



GETTING HERE

DRIVE

There's nothing quite like a drive along the historic Pacific Coast Highway. Take Highway 1 or Highway 101 north from Los Angeles or south from San Francisco. It'll land you right in downtown San Luis Obispo.

FLY

The San Luis Obispo County Regional Airport (SBP) offers a convenient, stress-free way to access San Luis Obispo and the surrounding region. Just a few minutes from downtown and with nine direct flights, getting to SLO is easy from anywhere.

BUS AND TRAIN

Catch the Amtrak to the San Luis Obispo station or hop on a Greyhound. Both use less CO2 (supporting our goal of going carbon neutral by 2035) and budget-friendly ways to get to SLO.



NEIGHBORHOODS

MOJO

The area around the Monterey and Johnson intersection is home to many hotels, a variety of fun dining options and the unofficial arcade district. You'll also find the main entrance to Cal Poly, easy access to downtown SLO and a direct entrance north to Highway 1.

RAILROAD DISTRICT

In the historic Railroad District, you can explore the family-friendly Railroad Museum, access the bustling Amtrak station and sample several local eateries. Bicycle and pedestrian paths allow for easy connectivity to downtown and nearby neighborhoods.

LOBRO

Art meets craft with a splash of outdoor adventure in the lower Broad area of SLO. In LoBro, explore South Hills Open Space and reward yourself after by visiting local craft breweries, cideries, wineries, restaurants and more.

SLO SOUTH

Whether you like wine, craft beer, kombucha or coffee, head to SLO South, the city's unofficial beverage district. At the corner of Tank Farm and South Higuera Street, this vibrant part of town is full of historic sites, trails, restaurants and shops to explore.

FOOTHILL

This lively neighborhood sits along Highway 1 with convenient access to Cal Poly and coastal beach towns to the north. Foothill has great outdoor spots for all types of recreation, including Santa Rosa Park and the San Luis Obispo Skate Park.

LOHI


LoHi is the quintessential spot to broaden your horizons with independent shops and casual dining. There's plenty of greenery to explore here too, like the central trails of South Hills Open Space and pickleball courts of Meadow Park.

AIRPORT DISTRICT

Within minutes of downtown, the Airport District offers easy-access to travel and a blossoming business district. As SLO's gateway to wine country, it invites you on a scenic drive through wineries and ranches before reaching Arroyo Grande and Pismo Beach to the south.

LAGUNA

At the intersection of convenience and adventure is the Laguna neighborhood. Find miles of trails, golf courses (of the regular and disc variety), an indoor archery range, a dog park, name brand stores, all the shopping essentials and of course, Laguna Lake itself.

THINGS TO DO



DOWNTOWN SLO

Downtown SLO is the heart of the city—where you can stay, eat, drink, shop, explore and relax.



SHOP LOCAL

In downtown SLO, independent shops thrive. From trendy boutiques to art galleries to surf shops and vintage stores, stroll the charming, tree lined streets.



BUBBLEGUM ALLEY

Don't forget to leave your mark on Bubblegum Alley while you're in town. The attraction is one of the strangest yet most popular in SLO, and is certainly the world's most famous. What can we say? We love sticky situations.



DOWNTOWN SLO FARMERS' MARKET

We don't just enjoy local food in San Luis Obispo, we celebrate it. You'll find a handful of farmers' markets around town, but most notable is the Downtown SLO Farmers' Market that takes over Higuera Street every Thursday from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m.



MISSION SAN LUIS OBISPO DE TOLOSA

Head to the center of downtown to explore the Mission San Luis Obispo de Tolosa. Founded in 1772, the mission offers a museum, docent tours, a gift shop and more. Residents and visitors enjoy Friday night concerts in the Mission Plaza during the summer, and the plaza attracts thousands of people each year for dozens of community events.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

CYCLING & MOUNTAIN BIKING

Winding back roads take cyclists through scenic rolling hills and vineyards, while tough climbs and incredible views make SLO a mountain biker's paradise. Protected bike lanes throughout the city also make traveling by bike not just simple, but safe.

GOLFING

San Luis Obispo's golf courses offer variety for all skill levels from juniors to life-long players. Play along the coast at Laguna Lake and Dairy Creek: Both host 9-hole courses, while the latter offers fun for all ages with a Swing Time driving range.

HIKING

With tens of thousands of acres of open space encircling the city, it's no wonder that hiking is a favorite pastime for SLO locals. Conquer one of the peaks for 360-degree views or hike deep into a canyon to explore creeks and waterfalls. There's a hike for everyone in SLO, no matter your age or fitness level. HORSEBACK RIDING

With an incredible landscape just waiting to be explored, there's no better place to saddle up for a horseback riding adventure. The area's 1,000+ acres of equestrian trails feature sweeping views of SLO's rolling hills, state parks and the bustling city.

KAYAKING AND PADDLE BOARDING

Nearby beach towns and lakes offer pristine, glassy waters for kayaking and the ever-more popular paddleboarding with rental shops nearby.

OFFROADING

The Oceano Dunes SVRA is the only beach in California that offers off-highway vehicle (OHV) recreation. Just a short drive from downtown SLO, it's the perfect place to get an adrenaline rush in an ATV or quad. And, for those who want to relax, the beach is right there—ready for lounging.

SLO COUNTY FARM TRAIL

Farms across SLO County welcome visitors for tours, workshops and plenty of shopping for locally made, handcrafted goods. Get outdoors and experience the Central Coast's agricultural side.

SLO SKATE PARK






